Facebook Live—101

Question: What is a Facebook Live? How do I see it?

Answer: A Facebook Live is a quick way to take a video of yourself or something/someone else and share it with an audience on Facebook. It's quick to set up, easy to use and view, and you have the ability to control the size of the audience you want to be able to see the video. It's probably the easiest way to "Live Stream" something. To view a Facebook Live post from Central: Log into Facebook. Click on the icon that looks like a ("Search"). glass magnifying "Central Christian Type in Church, Decatur, IL." This will give you options of pages to click on, but ours should be near the top. Click on our listing, and it will take you to our Facebook page. When the service begins recording (which will be VERY close to start time), you'll see a post pop up that says "Central Christian Church is live now," and you'll see the video playing. Click on it, and enjoy your worship experience!

Minister's Article

Remaining Connected

As you well know, connection is a core value for us at Central. We value connections with the next generation; with our neighborhood; with Christ; and with each other. That last one is certainly difficult during the forced physical separation and social distancing necessitated by the Coronavirus outbreak. The pandemic notwithstanding, we remember our call from Romans 12:5 - "...we, who are many, are one body in Christ." It is our goal that we not only remain "one body in Christ" for however long we live under these current conditions, but that we even grow stronger through them. To that end, we will be doing the following things to help us stay connected.

First, our newsletter will be formatted a bit differently. Without as much space needed to advertise upcoming events, we will offer two new features for content: a "<u>This Week in Central's History</u>" which will remind us of some of the significant things of our past that have shaped us; and "Praises and Petitions from the Community." If you would like to share with your fellow church members good news you've experienced in your life or a concern for which you would like prayer, let us know and we will seek to work them in.

Second, if you are on Facebook, you should know that I am going to try and provide a <u>3-4 minute video devotion</u> every weekday that is based on one of the "scriptures for the day" of our Lenten Spiritual Challenge. I am cross-posting this on both the church page and my personal one. I will also post videos of my son Thomas playing a religious or inspirational song. For those of you not on Facebook, you should know that you can open up a Facebook account and never have to put personal information on it. Consider it a "ticket for admission" to things like these videos (and other wonderful content on our church page) that will certainly help you feel more connected to your church family.

Most importantly, we are going to be instituting a "<u>Calling Program</u>" this week. It is my goal that every family unit in the church is called by telephone once a week for however long we are living in physical separation. It is important that we have some kind of "check in" whereby you know we are here, thinking of you and concerned for you; and likewise, that you have the opportunity to talk to someone who is there to listen and to share any specific needs you might have. Those calls should be starting something this week, so do not be surprised if you get one. If you do not want to be called every week, simply let the person know and there will be no hard feelings.

Those are some of the things we will do to reach out to you, and there is something important you can do for us. You can take care of each other. You can make periodic contact with those in your small groups and those *(continued on page 3....)*

that sit in your same area during worship. Romans 12:5 also says: *"Individually we are members of each other."* As members "of" each other, we are in this together, and whatever we have to endure, we will endure it together when we are committed to staying connected.

This Week in Central's History...

was also this week in 2014 that we were preparing to have a Seder Meal for our annual Maundy Thursday service. Here is what that announcement looked like in *The Visitor* on <u>March 24, 2014</u>:

Sign up for Maundy Thursday Seder Meal

Our Maundy Thursday service will be special this year. It will consist of two parts. The first part will be a version of the Seder meal (Passover) that Jesus celebrated at his Last Supper, during which he instituted what we know as communion. This will begin at 6:00 p.m. Children are welcome, though the nursery will be open for young ones. This part of the service will last over an hour. Then, we will move immediately to the sanctuary for the breaking of bread in communion. The whole service (both parts) will last about 90 minutes.
