#### **COVID-19 Updates for Central**

With the recent directive of the governor to continue shelter-in-place through May 30, all programming in the building will be suspended through this time and the office hours (for phone calls only) will be Tues-Thurs from 8 a.m. – 12 noon. The Illinois-Wisconsin region announced a change to the summer camp schedule. The CYF camp (grades 9-12) has been rescheduled for July 12-18. The Chi Rho camp (grades 6-8) will also be held that week, July 12-18, and JYF (grades 3-5) will be held July 19-25. There will still be Vacation Bible School in June, though it is shaping up to be a Virtual (online) VBS experience. Finally, the deadline to turn in applications for Higher Education Scholarships from Central until May 15. ## Minister's Article

### **For Your Quiet Thoughts...**

As we mentioned a few weeks ago in our online worship, we are still in the season of Easter. The season of Easter lasts 40 days after Easter Sunday. During that time, Jesus revealed himself as resurrected to more of his followers before he ultimately ascended into heaven. Before we leave the season of Easter 2020, I wanted to share something special here. Betty Chapman was going through some old things during this time of shelter-in-place and found something that Dr. Bill Nichols (senior minster at Central from 1973-1991) had written. During the season of Easter 1989, this was printed in the Sunday worship bulletin and titled "For Your Quiet Thoughts."

At first sight, it would seem that the Creator has been partial to pots and pans, stone buildings, and even chinaware, for by scores of years these creations may well outlast the substance of which our fragile bodies are made. A carpenter builds a house, and his grandchildren live in it. Some sculptor leaves a masterpiece in stone or marble that rises up to mock the brief life of its creator. The spoon with which you stirred your coffee this morning will probably be here long after you are gone. But surely this cannot be all of the truth!

If God be God, surely there must be something more lasting to human beings, God's greatest masterpiece, than flesh and bones. If this were not true, then the material world would possess a degree of immortality denied of us, who are its masters! I am convinced that the Easter message of the risen Christ brings to us the whole truth about immortality. This good news declares that the spirit that hopes and strives within its feverish, fleshly temple is eternal, and that that spirit will be living and working and loving somewhere long after its earthly creations of paper and wood and stone have crumbled into dust.

This is the message of Easter. It is a message that proclaims the mastery of mind over matter, spirit over flesh, light over darkness, good over evil. And it is in this sense that the resurrection of Jesus makes the hope of immortality a living force in the motives and habits of people. In His risen company, we dare to believe in the infinite potential of every soul and that all of us who have called upon His name are pilgrims of eternity merely sojourning in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, on a small planet called earth. We do not belong to Here and Now, but to Forever!

Easter is the soul's sweet spring singing into the night, and thawing the winter chill of doubt, despair and discouragement with its pure warm life. Easter takes the question marks of life and straightens them out into exclamation points. Easter does not talk <u>about</u> death. It speaks <u>to</u> death... and says "Good morning... Forever."
