Two Important Announcements about Worship at Central! 8:00 a.m. In-Person Worship to Resume

Beginning on Sunday, August 16, we will be offering 8:00 a.m. in-person worship again. The check-in procedures will be the same as for the 9:15 and 10:30 in-person services. You will still need to come in through the West Entrance doors, *no earlier than 7:50 a.m.*, and be checked-in by the front door hosts. For those not coming back at 8:00 a.m., we will continue to live-stream that service. We will therefore have three (3) online options and three (3) in-person options beginning August 16.

Currently, we have a team of 17 volunteers who have agreed to help us to staff the check-in table and with front door hosting responsibilities as we come back to in-person worship, but we would like to invite more volunteers to join the group! Anyone who has previously served as a greeter or usher, or anyone for that matter, is especially invited. Again, this new team of volunteers is taking the place of our previous practices of "ushering" and "greeting" as we learn to operate in a world changed by COVID-19. We are envisioning two (2) shifts on Sunday morning, beginning August 16.

Shift 1 will be 7:45 – 9:30 Shift 2 will be 9:30 – 11:30

BACK TO SCHOOL THOUGHTS... Empower Children With Knowledge and Simple Routines

Fred Rogers once said, "When children know ahead of time what's going to happen — and not happen — they can prepare themselves for what's coming. They can think about it and get used to their feelings about it."

Remember, whether they are studying in school or at home, your child will learn and grow this year — and that is worth celebrating.

Talk to your child about what school might look like in simple, practical terms. What are the names of their teachers? What will the morning routine at home look like? What will they need to put in their backpack each day? How will they get to school? And how might the school look different than it did the last time they were there?

If they are learning at home, where will their "learning area" be? What types of activities will they do with their teacher over video? What are some of the skills they will learn this year? In broad strokes, what will a typical day look like: school time, lunchtime, playtime? As the Daniel Tiger strategy song goes, "When we do something new, let's talk about what we'll do."

Amazing Grace

I would like to share a brief account of how Jessye Norman experienced the hymn Amazing Grace.

Jessye Norman was an incomparable singer of opera, art song, popular songs, and spirituals. In an interview in front of a live audience she was asked about the hymn Amazing Grace – why she included it in her concerts and did it have special meaning.

Ms. Norman replied that as she traveled around the world, she found that hymn was known and loved everywhere. She remembered singing in South Korea. At the end of the concert, she sang Amazing Grace, and the audience of 5,000 people sang it back to her. Another time when she had sung all the Duke Ellington material she and the orchestra had prepared and exhausted all the other possible encores, the people still stayed on. So she stepped up front and started singing Amazing Grace. She walked out among the audience sharing this beloved hymn. When she finished, someone told her that's what her grandmother used to do. She had NO IDEA she was copying her grandmother. This knowledge was very special to her.

Ms. Norman also believed that the origin of the hymn was significant. She recounted the story of John Newton who was a naval officer. His mission was to sail to the coast of West Africa and load up slaves to bring back to England. On one such trip they encountered a severe storm, and he was certain that everyone on the ship was going to perish – including the cargo in the bowels of the ship. John began to pray earnestly. Out of that prayer came the words to Amazing Grace.

Jessye Norman went on to speculate about the origin of the tune. She noted that the meter of the text was in three four time – one, two, three; one two, three. This was a common meter used in the music of West African people. She believed that the music came from the people trying to sing their way through this horrific ordeal, and the sound rose from the bowels of the ship, reaching John Newton's ears (and perhaps his heart).

When the storm calmed, John Newton was safe, and everyone on the ship was safe as well. After this life changing event, Newton went on to become an important minister and was a significant figure in the struggle to abolish slavery.

"Amazing grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me."

Indeed, John Newton was involved in wretched business. This story was significant for Jessye Norman because, no doubt, her ancestors were also cargo on just such a ship.

"I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see." Blessings.
