Minister's Article

Preaching and Teaching...

Our sermons from this past Sunday and this coming one are taken from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. That's how Matthew, chapters 5-7, have come down to us... as Jesus' first "sermon." In fact, there is a good chance that the bible you're reading these days has a heading or footnote (or both) that calls this section of the bible the "Sermon" on the Mount. Technically, however, I wonder if we shouldn't put quotes (" ") around the word sermon, because Jesus never said it was a "sermon." Neither did Matthew. We did. Matthew (5:2) says that when Jesus went up the mountain with his followers, he sat down and "taught" them, and therein lies the question. Are preaching and teaching the same? Or is there a difference, more than mere semantics?



If there is a difference, it might be found in this distinction. Preaching is primarily one-way communication. Its function is to convey and impart information. Think of the typical Sunday. Other than the occasional head-nod-of-agreement when the preacher is speaking, or perhaps the intermittent "Amen!" or "Preach on, brother!," preaching is one-way communication. And Jesus certainly preached, as when he read from the scroll of Isaiah in Luke 4 and informed and conveyed that the scripture was fulfilled in the communicating of these words.

But teaching is different. It is both about imparting information and... the listening, absorbing, and understanding of that information. Teaching is a more dynamic, back-and-forth activity. Students ask questions. Teachers provide clarification. Questions and answers lead to further discussion and deeper involvement with the topic at hand. This is the essence of Jesus' ministry with his disciples. There was constant back and forth with them... questions, answers, clarification, discussion. No wonder Jesus was known — from beginning to end of his ministry — as "Rabbi" (teacher). Likewise no wonder that Matthew chose the phrase "he taught them" and not "he preached to them" or "he lectured to them" for a reason.

Teaching was important for Jesus because he wanted followers. It is *(continued on page 3...)*

noteworthy that Jesus never said "worship me." He said "follow me." He was not looking for a relationship with us in which he would pontificate from on high and we, the masses, would bow down and adore him for such heavenly wisdom. When we do worship Jesus it is as the second person of the trinity; the manifestation of the divine presence; God in human form. But the carpenter's son from Galilee? He was looking for followers. Which is why he worked so hard to "teach" us. He wanted us not just to hear his word, but absorb it and understand it. That was the only way to follow in his footsteps and carry on his God-with-us presence in his absence.

I may continue to refer to Matthew 5-7 as the "Sermon" on the Mount in everyday conversation. There is something familiar about that title that, should it be changed, would cause confusion. But privately, I will continue to enjoy thinking of this part of the bible as the "Teaching on the Mount." For it serves as reminder of the importance of the kind of relationships that only teaching can cultivate and how integral these relationships were to Jesus' ministry.
