### A Holy Nation

In our scripture reading form I Peter last Sunday (2:4-10) we heard Peter tell the churches in modern-day Turkey that they were a "holy nation." In the same breath he called them a "chosen race" as well. Words like "nation" and "race" certainly conjure up manifold images and emotions in us today, though Peter intended them to be received differently and in a way that can help us today.

First, the concept of "race," for Peter, would have referred more broadly to ancestry – the place and people from you one descended. In fact, it is where our word "genealogy" comes from. It would not have meant the more narrow way we have come to think of race in terms of skin color. The word used for "nation" by Peter *is* where our word "ethnicity" comes from, but the original word in Greek could mean everything from "tribe" to a more general "company of people gathered together." It would not have referred to a nation-state as we understand in the modern sense.

Additionally, many Christians in the churches Peter was addressing were "Gentiles." Though Christian at the time, they did not convert to Christianity from Judaism but from paganism. Jews had a name for everyone who was not Jewish. It was "Gentile." In the Jewish worldview, one was either Jewish or non-Jewish, and all non-Jews were Gentiles, but that's a pretty wide lane isn't it? The concept of Gentile (non-Jew) would encompass a vast range of tribes and, what we could call today races and ethnicities. Consider if we divided the world today into, say, Germans and non-Germans. The gigantic mass of non-German people would represent 200 countries, 6,500 languages and every skin tone from very light to very dark. Most interestingly, Gentiles were *not* considered by Jews to be "one nation" at all. In fact, the casual way of referring to them in scripture was "the nations" as in plural; with an "s" at the end. Nations!

Therein lies the revolutionary thing Peter does. He creates one nation out of many, and he makes as the basis of that oneness not geographical borders and boundaries; not a common spoken language; not a set of laws or governing constitution; and not skin tone or ancestral affiliation, but faith! In Christ! To be a holy nation is to stand on the precious cornerstone that is Jesus and build a spiritual dwelling upon him... for him! All who do this, regardless of whatever other distinguishing characteristics identify them, are part of that "chosen race" and "holy nation." In other words, faith in Christ transcends every other way we might distinguish ourselves from one another.

When I lived in Germany, there was poster hanging on the wall of the youth room of our parish. It had a black and white photo of two people hugging with some words overlaid. They read, "What would the world be like if Christians agreed to stop killing each other." The phrase was a holdover from WWII and the Cold War. But I wonder today – in our country with so much polarization... what things might be like if Christians agreed to *talk* with each other; *listen* to each other; share stories of life experiences *with* each other? What if our starting point when engaging one another was our common faith and not our un-common differences? We might still have over 200 distinct Christian congregations in Decatur as we do now, but might we not also realize more of that oneness, which Peter references, than we do now? I want to believe that would be the case.
