Minister's Article

Stewardship 2021



It would be the greatest of understatements to say that things have changed in 2020! Because of these changes, we have had to learn how to be community without relying on many of the ways we have defined being a community in the past. Some things have remain UN-changed as well. Our love for Central has not been compromised by the Coronavirus. Our generous support of the ministries of our congregation are immune to the first global pandemic in 100 years. And... perhaps most importantly... our sense of oneness will not change. We have continued to be <u>One</u> family of believers, with <u>One</u> faith in <u>One</u> Jesus Christ with <u>One</u> mission and guided by <u>One</u> hope in the <u>One</u> Holy Spirit.

The next four weeks will be our annual emphasis on stewardship, when we consider the impact our financial contributions can have on the ministries of Central. At the end of the four weeks (October 18), we will be invited to provide an estimate of what we think we are able to contribute to the church's ministries in 2021. Though this is an estimate, receiving them allows the church leadership to prepare a budget for the coming year.

The theme of our stewardship emphasis this year will be "Un-Changed: Connected in Christ." Whether you are participating online or in person, we believe you will be encouraged and inspired by what we have planned. You will receive a letter the week of 9/28 outlining these experiences, at which time we will also display them online. COVID-19 Update

We wanted to take this opportunity and inform of you something procedural that may involve our church in the future. In conversations with the Macon County Health Department, we have learned that if anyone using our building (church member or otherwise) tests positive for COVID-19, the Health Department will determine if we need to contact building-users, in order to notify them of their potential contact with the virus (this is why, incidentally, we have everyone sign in every day they are in our building). All positive tests are registered with the state, and then the corresponding county health departments are then contacted to begin contact tracing. If the Health Department has not contacted us, we are not required to do any notifying of our own. Should we ever be asked to do so, anonymity will be protected in communications from the church. We share this, because a person who regularly participates in activities within our building has recently tested positive for COVID-19. Because this person's last activity in our building occurred well before symptoms were experienced, the Macon County Health Department has not asked us to do any contact tracing of our own. It does not believe anyone using Central's building in the last two weeks is at risk from this particular positive case. The Health Department does, however, encourage us to remind those using our building to monitor their own symptoms, take their temperatures regularly, and stay home if not feeling well in any way. We agree that this is a good thing to do. We want to be as transparent as we can be regarding what is happening in our building so that you can take the action you feel is most appropriate for your own safety and well-being. Thank you for your attentiveness to our building procedures. It is for reasons such as this that we sign in, take temperatures, wear masks, and wash hands.
