Staying Connected

I wanted to take this opportunity to clarify how we are utilizing volunteers on Sunday mornings for in-person worship. We seek to be as informative and transparent as possible for how we are embracing the changes that 2020 had presented to us. Should you desire clarification on anything you read here, feel free to contact me directly or Kathleen in the church office.

Regarding <u>ushers</u>: we are not using ushers as we were prior to March. That is, ushers are not currently handing out bulletins or counting attendance, since those things are being handled in other ways. Therefore, we have suspended the 2020 usher schedule until such time as we return to in-person worship without social distancing guidelines. If those guidelines are lifted, we will reinstate the 2020 schedule. However, we still have a need for ushers who are now taking on a few new responsibilities. If you are an usher and wish to be put on a new usher schedule, we would love to have you. If you were not an usher, but would be interested in helping in this regard, the same holds true for you. Simply let us know and we'll give you more information and put you in the rotation.

Regarding <u>greeters</u>: similar to ushers, we have suspended the 2020 greeter schedule until such time as we return to in-person worship without social distancing guidelines. If those guidelines are lifted, we will reinstate the 2020 schedule.

Regarding <u>deacons</u>: similar to ushers and greeters, we have suspended the 2020 deacon schedule until such time as we return to in-person worship without social distancing guidelines. Since we are not using trays to collect offerings or pass communion, we feel this the best step to take at the moment. However, if you are a deacon and would like to be involved in other ways, please let us know.

Regarding <u>west entrance check-in</u>: new since the pandemic are three (3) new positions that never before existed. **One (1) greeter** is now used to help guide traffic in and out of the building. **Two (2) front table hosts** take temperatures and sign people in. We would love to add you to the team of volunteers who are serving in these new roles – whether you are an usher, greeter, deacon, or otherwise interested. Currently, we have **two (2) Sunday morning shifts**.

Shift #1 7:45 a.m. – 9:30 a.m.

Shift #2 9:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.

Once we build the team of volunteers sufficiently, we may add a third shift so that there is one shift per service.

Our philosophy has been that we will not pressure anyone to come back to in-person worship. Therefore, it was never our intent to "assign" people to Sunday volunteer roles (as usher, greeter or deacon) once shelter-in-place began in March. Rather, we want to see who feels comfortable coming back to in-person worship and proceed from there. In that respect, allow me to reiterate that you are most welcome being added to a new team of volunteers at any time. Our scheduling is flexible enough that we can add people to the rotation fairly seamlessly (Donna Dash, Christine Lyman-Harm, and Mike and
