

Minister's Article

LISTENING

The future seems to be at the forefront of conversation here at Central Christian Church, and questions about our future path arise. Not the least of which is, "What might we (as a church) do to carry out our mission in an everchanging world for both now and the future?" I think we could find an answer through listening: Active Listening and Double Listening.

First, Active listening is important. An article from <u>mindtools.com</u> describes active listening as follows: Active listening is where you make a conscious effort to hear not only the words that another person is saying but, more importantly, the **complete message** being communicated. Active listening is not judgmental, it seeks to understand. To do this, we must pay attention to the other person very carefully. Active listening is only part of the listening equation to solving our problem though. Second, we could practice double listening.

John Stott was an Anglican priest, theologian, and author who wrote about double listening. Double listening is the practice of listening to two voices at once. In this case, the voice of God as it is revealed through Scripture, and the voices of men and women (living in the world) around us.

Stott wrote,

These voices will often contradict one another, but our purpose in listening to them both is to discover how they relate to each other. Double listening is indispensable to Christian discipleship and Christian mission.

I believe we are called to the difficult and even painful task of "double listening." That is, we are to listen carefully (although of course with differing degrees of respect) both to the ancient Word and to the modern world, in order to relate the one to the other with a combination of fidelity and sensitivity.

As we reach out to embrace others (within the church and outside the church)

with God's love, as we practice active and double listening, the end goal of bridging the gap between the two voices is not only doable but probable. So, what does this have to do with the question posed earlier, "What might we (as a church) do to carry out our mission in an everchanging world for both now and the future?"

The world in which we live is ever-changing. God is unchanging. As we listen-truly listen-with a mind towards reconciliation, then act toward that reconciliation, God's love will be evident in our actions, words, and deeds. God's love draws people together in connectedness, relationship, and mission.
