



Gratitude: The Antidote to Despair

In this past Sunday's sermon, I shared that when I read I am most likely to pick up something non-fiction. That probably doesn't come as too much of a surprise, considering that many of you know I am a fan of all things historical. So when it comes to listening to podcasts (which I do with great frequency and regularity), the genre of "true stories" is guaranteed to capture my attention. I have always been drawn to real-life stories of adventure and survival. In my sixth-grade class, for example, there was a bookshelf full of Reader's Digest magazines along the back wall, and when we had "free reading" time, I would take a stack of those back to my desk. I wouldn't read anything in them except the one article in every issue called "Drama in Real Life." I am still a sucker for a good "drama in real life" story all these many years later.

One such story was told in Season 2 of "Against All Odds," by the Wondery production company. It tells the story of Jessica Buchanan, of Ohio, who worked as an NGO aide in Somalia in 2011. She was there with her husband, Erik. One day in October, however, on a mission with a Danish colleague Poul, she and Poul were kidnapped by land pirates. For 93 days she and Poul were held in captivity until U.S. soldiers from Seal Team 6 rescued them both. The podcast walks the listener through the days leading up to the capture, how both Jessica and Poul endured their captivity, and the details of the harrowing rescue. At the end of the season, as is common in Wondery podcasts, the final episode contained an interview between the host and Jessica Buchanan herself. Buchanan talked about many things – the book she published; her speaking engagements; how she handled the trauma of PTSD; the family she now has with Erik; etc... Toward the end of the interview, however, she mentioned something not initiated from a question by the host, but which came across to me as the most important part of the conversation.



Throughout the 93 days, she and Poul were often held in areas separate from each other. But whenever they were together, they obviously did what they could do to encourage each other. One of the things they did in that regard early in their captivity was to agree together that they would do two things they felt necessary for survival. First, they would allow themselves to feel any emotion except one. They would allow themselves to feel anger, rage, sadness, even happiness. The only emotion they would *not* allow themselves to feel was despair. Secondly, in order to prevent themselves from feeling despair, they would identify 5 things for which they were grateful every day, and spend the day thinking only of those things.

I couldn't help but think of how often we, in the safe and comparably cloistered life of the church, talk about the importance of thanksgiving; how vital it is to practice saying "thank you" to our creator, and cultivating gratitude through such practice of thanksgiving. And here is the proof of just how vital and important it is. Hopefully, none of us reading these words will ever have to face the kind of trauma that Jessica and Poul did, and yet the encouragement is nonetheless there for us as well. Whatever our present life circumstances may be, let us also focus on identifying on a handful of things every day for which we are grateful. It is not just a noble and polite thing to do. It is the antidote to despair. And in that sense, it is truly life-saving.

I was amazed at how each cell in our body is made perfectly and comes together in such a mighty way to create a human being. No human could do that----it has to be God. The "bigness" of God is why I am a Christian. Finally, I am a Christian because I know that God is in control. He knows what the future holds. As a Christian, I know that my future is full of His glory.
