Harmony Restored

We prepare to celebrate Don Martin's last month of worship with us as Minister of Music and Visitation with a special emphasis in worship. Our theme from March 30 – June 20 will be *Harmony Restored*. When Adam and Eve committed that first act of disobedience in Eden – the "original sin" – the ripple effects were manifold. In particular, that single act created four (4) disruptions, between - humanity and <u>itself</u>; humanity and <u>God</u>; humanity and <u>one another</u>; and humanity and <u>creation</u>. With the coming of Christ, however, we have the possibility of restoration and reconciliation in each of those relationships. The intent of this reconciliation is that the original harmony of the God's original paradise will be realized and experienced by all of us in a new one – that harmony will be restored.



In addition, we will be treated to two (2) special anthems each week at the traditional services. These represent some of Don's favorites – either because of text, melody, or both. Each Sunday's music is meant to complement the themes raised by the scripture and the sermon. We certainly hope you will be able to join us for each of these important Sundays, either virtually or in-person. Your Faith in 60 Seconds

During the weeks preceding Easter, we introduced a challenge to everyone: Describe why you are a Christian in 60 seconds. Why we believe in Christ and not something (someone) else? Many have taken us up on this challenge and have shared their testimonies with us. As they do, we are asking them to share them in worship. We will then publish the testimony in *The Visitor* the following week. Paul Gorden, regular attender of all our services, elder and leader of our two (2) Journeymen's bible study groups, offered his faith in 60 seconds this past Sunday. Here is what he said:

I have believed in God and Jesus since I was a youth. What no one told me to do after baptism was to develop an intentional, life-long personal relationship with Jesus. Instead, I tried to do things the way the World tells us, hoping for a fulfilling, successful life. Unfortunately, life going the way you want it to doesn't necessarily happen.

Fast-forward through two-thirds of my life and I'm on the heels of one of the lowest points of my life not knowing that my best journey had already begun. I was at a men's retreat where I read the

book "The 365 Days of Christmas" by William J. Bryon, a Jesuit priest. The entirety of the book is forgotten save for one quote that I truly believe I was lead to find and remember. The quote is:

"[Following] Jesus promises you two things: your life will have meaning, and you'll live forever. If you can find a better offer, take it!"

I have learned that doing things the World's way can <u>NEVER, EVER</u> provide you eternal life. Once this mortal life is over, that's it, there's nothing else. There may not be a hell for you, but there's definitely no heaven, either. But, Jesus proves... every day...that with Him, everlasting life is available to everyone who wants it! He demonstrated it through His own voluntary death, and then He returned to physical life, just as we have now sitting here with each other. Sure, you say, that's easy when you're the Son of God, but how is that possible for us?? Jesus' plan is oh so simple: ask Him for it, and then devote the remainder of your earthly life to following His instruction. Good luck finding a better offer than that!
