Minister's Article

Fathers Day Tribute

(From Elder Gail Prince, delivered as a devotion at the June elders meeting)
With Fathers Day being this Sunday, June 20, it caused me to think of my dad's favorite scripture. I'm not sure I knew it was dad's favorite when I was a child, but once mom and dad passed away, I inherited my mother's bible. They carried this bible to every church they attended since I had given this bible to my mom on Mothers Day in 1985. They loved to share the Word and sit close in church. What a treasure it was to find scribbled above Proverbs 22:6, in my mom's tiny handwriting, "H.P.'s favorite." The reason my dad used his initials is because his mom named him Hazel Pratt! He said that when he was growing up he was teased about his name. The kids would sing a song, "Red headed Pratt, sittin' on a fence, tryin' to make a dollar out of 15 cents." He knew that if ever he grew up, he would be called anything but Hazel Pratt.

I always knew dad was a Christian. He was born in 1925 and registered for the Army at age 17 and served in Germany during WWII. Dad only had an 8th grade education because he had to quit school to help provide for his mom. My grandmother (we called her Mammy), was divorced and forced to raise two ornery boys in Owensboro, KY. Mammy liked to tell about how out of control her sons were. They liked to run off to the Ohio River and swim (that is... skinny dipping). Finally, one day, she just walked to the river and took their clothes out of the bushes, forcing them to walk home in the dark with leafy branches in front of them. A lesson was learned. My folks married in 1943. They were 19 years old when I was born. I was 9 months old before my dad saw me, because he was serving in Germany.

Dad moved us all to Illinois in 1950 and he worked different jobs. I can still hear him saying things like, "That garden will grow when Jesus sends us rain," or "You need to learn this task to get into heaven." Dad was eventually hired at Caterpillar and after years in the factory, he became president of the Local 751 Union Hall. When he retired, he was an international union representative for the UAW. Dad would tell us that "Jesus gave him his hard work ethic and his smarts and how this wasn't too bad for a kid with an 8th grade education."



I don't think I had any idea how many sacrifices dad made for our family until I became a parent myself. And the older I get, the more I catch myself acting like him. Dad loved life and he loved people. Dad was always upbeat and happy. But the greatest thing he taught me was his love for Jesus and his favorite scripture — Proverbs 22:6. "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old, they will not turn from it."

Your Faith in 60 Seconds

During the weeks preceding Easter, we introduced a challenge to everyone: Describe why you are a Christian in 60 seconds. Why we believe in Christ and not something (someone) else? Many have taken us up on this challenge and have shared their testimonies with us. As they do, we are asking them to share them in worship. We will then publish the testimony in *The Visitor* the following week. Diana Ritter, a very active member of Central since she and her husband joined in 2016 and currently an elder, offered her faith in 60 seconds this past Sunday. Here is what she said:

My faith began as an infant; I was baptized at Zion Chapel Methodist Church as an infant. I made my confession of faith in 8th grade after completing several weeks of study. My faith journey continued as a youth. Sunday evenings was for one thing only- youth group. We not only continued to learn about what it was to be a Christian, we were also taught to be a leader in our church. I also was very lucky



to have Sunday School teachers that lived a life of faith that I wanted to model. Now, my faith has been a roller coaster depending on what is going on in my life. But that being said it has always been there for me and a major part of raising our 3 boys and a major part of a Christian marriage for 41 years. Tom and I have often said, we couldn't have gotten through certain situations if it hadn't been for our faith. I do feel those low points in my roller coaster of faith have made me a stronger Christian. I do talk with God more often and find comfort in my devotions. I also know that, at times, I do take my faith for granted when I am coasting on the roller coaster of faith. As my faith has matured, I do know when God is talking to me, and I do pay more attention to those moments. I have learned over the years to listen, to what I call, the God things.
