## A Nurturing Congregation

What a blessing it is to able to share the news of Hannah Fitch's ordination on August 1 at 3:00 p.m. at First Christian Church, Peoria! Though Hannah was not raised at Central and calls another congregation her "church home," we will certainly claim her as one of ours as well. From 2010 through 2015, she was an integral part of our faith family – first as a choir member, then as a youth intern, and finally as a staff person working with youth and young adults. She left us to answer the call to the ministry and began a long road that took her to the University of Chicago's Divinity School and which culminates with her ordination on August 1.

Though we are not hosting the ordination service, we have been asked to present Hannah with the gift of a stole. The stole is worn around the neck of clergy during worship. Our church will formally present Hannah with three (3) stoles at the ordination service.

But Hannah's is not the only ordination on our schedule. Sometime this autumn, Zach Martin will be ordained at Central. Of course, Zach <u>did</u> grow up in this congregation. This <u>is</u> his "home church." He was raised by Sunday school and youth group here. We were there to send him off to a Disciples of Christ college and later to Christian Theological Seminary (the alma mater of his mother and father). We have helped sponsor his call to ministry and supported him along the way. And we are proud and glad to serve as the host congregation for his ordination.

Of course, hosting Zach's ordination will not be entirely new to us. Not even two years ago, we hosted Tina Miller's ordination service as well. Tina joined our staff just as Hannah was leaving it. Though she was raised in other congregations, and we joined Tina toward the end of a vocational discernment that had begun years earlier, were the crucible in which she found her ultimate ordination home.

To be able to be so heavily involved in the ministerial formation of three people in such a short window of time is such a blessing! This is a credit to you, the congregation. To contemplate, undertake and complete the journey to ministry is one that involves a hard work, emotional vulnerability, and incredible faith and trust. Congregations that are able to provide the safe, loving, and nurturing environment in which ministerial candidates and work out these, and other, issues is a tremendous blessing to the wider church. I am proud and honored of Central for being one of those congregations, and I hope you join me in these feelings.

#### Ben Hawkinson's Faith in 60 (ish) Seconds

For the last two years, it has been a pleasure to call Central Christian Church our home. In March of last year, we, like many others, began to participate virtually at home. This choice has placed us in the odd position of being "attendees for years" and "new to you". Please don't be shy about introducing yourselves! We are pleased to connect with you, whether it be as old friends or for the first time.

As a musician, the Psalms have, naturally, held a special place in my heart. The 90th Psalm is one that I take particular comfort in. This might be surprising, as after the initial "Lord, you have been our refuge from one generation to another" this Psalm contains

some not-so-hopeful moments like, "All our days pass away under your wrath (v.9)", and "We are consumed by your anger (v.7)" or "If we only knew the power of your anger! (v.11)". But at the end of this Psalm is something that immediately catches the eye of a conductor of choirs - a repetition of text.

In music, we are constantly striving to find musical gestures that relate to natural speech. When we think about the times we naturally repeat a phrase, it is always for additional impact or an added intensity. In no other moment is another phrase repeated in this Psalm. The final verse reads, "May the beauty of the Lord our God rest on us; establish the work of our hands for us—yes, establish the work of our hands." Our author, here, is Moses who having seen the wrath of God firsthand is seemingly most concerned about the work that God has set out for him. My inspiration from this Psalm comes from seeing this incredible figure, Moses, who experienced days far darker than any I've encountered set his sights on continuing the work of the Lord from one generation to the next.

God's church, both the people and the physical sanctuary where we gather in weekly, stands on the efforts of those who have come before. The saints who have toiled before have handed to us the blessings of the work of their hands—work that persisted in days when times were difficult, and where God's anger was made known. The comfort that Psalm 90 provides is not a promise that days will be easy, but rather God's work in both times easy and difficult is an expression of the "beauty of the Lord our God".
