Still Holy

In light of our scripture reading this past Sunday, describing the baptism of Jesus, I was reminded of my visit to that sacred place. As I have shared on other occasions, one of the highlights of my ministry has been a 2008 trip to the Holy Land (modern-day Israel/Palestine). During it, Amy and I visited many of the holy sites where some of the most significant events from Jesus' life and ministry took place. Amid all that was beautiful, sacred, awe-inspiring, and moving on that trip, there were two things that consistently caught me off-guard. The first was the "ordinariness" of the holy sites. The geographical territory of that part of the world is so small and dense – and the population so condensed within it - every day life happens right next-door to the holiest of places. Before I left, I had some expectation this would be the case, but it was still jarring to be in worship in Jerusalem and hear the pastor announce (for example), "the youth volleyball game will take place this Tuesday on the Mount of Olives." What??? A volleyball game? Right next to the Garden of Gethsemane? It still doesn't quite seem right; quite holy enough.

The second was the commercialized nature of the holy sites themselves. Though in retrospect it shouldn't have been shocking, it still somehow was – the fact that nearly every holy site had a gift shop selling pictures, postcards, and t-shirts on the premises. Nowhere were both of these more obvious than at the recognized site of Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River.

In some places of the country, the Jordan River is so narrow it would more accurately be called a stream which, with a good running start, might even be jumped over. At the site called "Yardenit" however, the river widens and deepens a bit, though would still rightly be called an oversized creek or at the very most, a small river. Not more than a few hundred yards from the holy site was a bridge on which traffic zoomed back and forth, while on the other side of the bridge was a bank of office buildings in and out of which people continuously streamed.

On the day our tour group visited Yardenit, there were dozens and dozens of buses lining parking lot. Of course, Amy and I took off our shoes and got a picture standing in the water. But there was a long line of people from their own tour groups, and from countries around the world, waiting in line to stand in the water and baptize one another. In the requisite gift shop, one could purchase a baptismal robe with an ironed-on image of Jesus on the front. A videographer would record your baptism and have a DVD of it ready for you by the time you dried off. And from a wagon right outside the door, holy water from the River Jordan could be purchased in various sizes.

After Amy and I had our picture in the water, we stood above the river and next to the gift shop. As we took it all in – the bridge with traffic in the background, the Jesus-iron-on baptismal robes, the holy water sellers hawking their wares - "surreal" was the word that came to mind. The holy site seemed too contrived; too secular; too influenced by capitalism; too plain and ordinary and not "holy" enough. And yet, even in the midst of all that my mind was judging, it was still holy. And truthfully, probably as accurate a representation of what Jesus' ministry looked like. Jesus came to bring holiness to *all* of life; to pronounce all that life has to offer holy; to make the plain, special and the profane, sacred. And that if it is up to anyone to see that and recognize it, it is not Jesus, but us.
