Patience: more than a Virtue

There are many wonderful discussion-worthy aspects of our scripture reading this past Sunday. Jesus' first sign: turning water into wine at the wedding in Cana. One of them, which might not be recognized as quickly as others, has to do with patience. So important to us in our life of faith, probably because nearly all of us could stand to practice it more. Think about it, how many people have you met in your life who have said, "My spiritual gift is patience," or "Patience comes so easily to me?" So for all our sakes, patience makes an appearance at the wedding in Cana.

When Mary says to Jesus, "They have no wine," she implies that he can do something about it. Of course, Jesus does do something about it. He turns water into wine. But Mary seems to imply something more; something about Jesus revealing his full identity as the son of God. We know this because Jesus answers, "My hour has not yet come." Jesus is not referring here to time as we keep it with watches and calendars. He's not wanting Mary to know that he'll get to it later in the evening, or after he's finished eating. When Jesus speaks of his "hour," he's referring to time in the largest sense; the divine, universal sense. He's referring to something more akin to his moment in history. And we know this, because at the end of the gospel, when Jesus is arrested in the garden of Gethsemane, he tells his disciples that his time *HAS* come. The moment in history was then right for him to reveal his true mission and purpose through the crucifixion and resurrection.

This tells us that the intervening three years – between the wedding in Cana at the beginning of his ministry and his arrest at the end of it – were necessary to Jesus' plan and process of salvation. Mary wanted something to happen in the moment. But Jesus' answer was "not yet," because there were still things that needed to happen in order for God's plans to be fulfilled. This is where we come in, because we often come before God asking for some action or intervention *now*, on our time. But God's answer might actually be "not yet," because the moments that lie ahead of us might be necessary to our redemption and healing.

The ancient Greeks – especially from the Aristotelian school – were fond of stating the “patience is a virtue.” It was one of the characteristics that, when practiced, contributed to the ideal person. For people of faith, it is more than this. It is a vital part of our redemption and salvation. As the Gospel shows, there may be things in our future that are necessary for our spiritual growth and well-being that we would not experience if not for patience. So even though the words “Have patience” are ones that not many of us want to hear, and words which can come across as condescending at times, they are nonetheless true from a spiritual perspective.



One of the best ways I heard stated the value of patience was from a Carthusian monk. He said something to this effect – *We, who walk through life with hurried steps, ask God to come to us and walk alongside us. Better is to pray to for the strength and courage to walk*

beside God, who is never in a hurry.
