Obtain your Advent Candles (and Wreath) Now...

Advent 2020 begins on Sunday, November 29 (the Sunday of Thanksgiving weekend). This is the season that encompasses the 4 Sundays prior to Christmas and helps us prepare spiritually for Christ's coming. For Advent at Central Christian 2020, we are asking you to pay attention to the following:

- Order NOW your own <u>advent wreath with candles</u> OR just the <u>advent</u> <u>candles</u>. See the box to the right for a few links to show you some options. There should be <u>4 candles (3 purple and 1 pink</u>). You may or may not include a wreath with those candles, and you may prefer votives to tapers, but either way, make your plans to purchase your own. During this pandemic of 2020, we have some <u>creative ways of uniting our congregation</u> <u>around the advent candles</u> (both the in-person and the on-line) with some activities that you can do at home with your household as you prepare for Christmas.
- We plan on supplying you (the church family household) with a <u>litany that</u> you can recite and pray each weekend of Advent! This will be the SAME litany that we will be speaking during worship that Sunday morning! This way, you and your household can:
 - a. Participate in the litany on Sunday morning as you watch online worship
 - b. Or... if you are attending in-person worship that day, you can re-create that litany with your household at some other time that weekend.

Note: The important thing is that you purchase your advent candles and/or **year.** Dove has teamed up with the wreath now (due to possible back-orders). We (the church) are only offering Salvation Army and the Northeast these links (to the right) as suggestions for the kinds of things to have ready by Community Fund to most efficiently meet 11/29/20 (the first Sunday of Advent), and if you already have your own advent the high volume of need for assistance this year. Easter in November???

Since the pandemic arrived in early Spring, I have spent a lot of time in our sunroom. When we moved into our current house in early summer 2016, we didn't know exactly how we would utilize a ground floor room that the previous owner added as an addition. Since it has many windows and receives plentiful sunlight through all seasons, we have called it "the sunroom," and during the shelter in place, this room became my "home within a home." It is where I held my morning devotions (as opposed to my office) and where I recorded daily devotions which were posted to Facebook. It was the place I prepared sermons and made pastoral phone calls, and it has long become my favorite location for Zoom meetings.

Through all this activity in the sunroom, I have been able to observe – first hand – the changing of the seasons from a new vantage point. At the beginning of the pandemic, there were no leaves on the trees (our sunroom backs up to a park), and our garden was void of any life at all, but over the past eight months, I have enjoyed witnessing the magnolia's petals come to life; the lilies awaken; the wildflowers rise and bend toward the sunlight; and the butterflies and bees return as the vegetable garden brought forth its growth. (Bear in mind, in no way do I have a "green thumb" nor worthy of even the title "apprentice gardener," but I have always loved having greenery and colorful flowers around me and enjoy contributing the ecosystem's flourishing in whatever way I can).



Sadly, though, as the weeks and month of the pandemic continued, that same sunroom perspective allowed me to see – first-hand – decline and decay. Today, in mid-November, the trees are just as bare as they were at the onset of shelter-in-place, and the garden is just as barren, and still, we live amid the coronavirus pandemic.


But the other day, something caught my eye. Lining the back wall of the sunroom are about 10 potted plants that have slowly created a "green wall" for my viewing enjoyment. Nestled underneath the tall, arching plants in big pots is a small plant in a small pot. Most of the year it is easily overlooked and overshadowed by its bigger siblings, but it is a Christmas Cactus, which means that is just now coming into bloom. Technically, it is a variety of *Schlumbergera*, a plant indigenous to Brazil and, as a flower of the southern hemisphere, blooms in the northern hemisphere's falls and winters. I happened to notice my Christmas Cactus the other day, and I'm glad I did, for as the world outside was in the midst of decay and decline, here was an example of life and re-birth in the midst of death. It was a reminder of God's desire to find new life from places in our lives that reveal only dormancy.

Easter will never be celebrated in November. But God's ability to bring forth life from death, hope from despair, flourishing from decay, and abundance from dormancy is not bound to seasons or hemispheres. Thanks be to God!
