Details About the Congregational "Meeting"

Every year in December, at a date set by the congregation's president, the Central Christian congregation gathers for a meeting at which a vote is taken to approve the Nominating Committee's report along with the operating budget for the coming year. Not surprisingly, the COVID-19 pandemic has forced us to modify this annual regulation. Instead, we will have a "drive-thru vote." Here's what is planned:

- President Gregg Foltz has called a special congregational vote for Dec. 13.
- Between now and then copies of the Nominating Committee report and the proposed operating budget for 2021 are available inside the West Entrance doors. You may come by anytime the office is open and pick up a copy of each.
- On Sunday Dec. 13, between 11:45 12:30, you are asked to drive by the West Entrance. At that time, a ballot will be given to you to fill out.
- Results of the vote will be communicated by email later that night and in the following week's newsletter.

Note: this is meant to coincide with the "Come Home for Christmas" take-away dinner served at the same time.

In Sympathy We Mourn



Minister's Article

The Worst of Us and the Rest of Us

Over the Thanksgiving weekend, I finished Frederick Backman's latest novel, <u>Anxious People</u>. If you liked Backman's earlier book, <u>A Man Called Ove</u>, then you will love this latest one for some of the same reasons. (Side note: and if you appreciated the plot twist in Spike Lee's bank heist <u>Inside Man</u>, you will likewise appreciate a similar set up in <u>Anxious People</u>).



Without giving away any more of the book's storyline, I will share here that Backman concludes with words such as these:

They say that a person's personality is the sum of their experiences. But that isn't true, at least not entirely, because if our past was all that defined us, we'd never be able to put up with ourselves. We need to be allowed to convince ourselves that we're more than the mistakes we made yesterday. That we are all of our next choices, too, all of our tomorrows.

Though the book is not explicitly Christian in any obvious way, I felt a connection to the season of Advent in this paragraph. Advent is about a journey that begins in darkness, but which ends in light. It is a journey that Christ – the light – makes to find us in our darkness and bring his light to bear on our lives. Spiritually speaking, darkness represents the "worst of us." It represents sin, brokenness, grief, and pain. It stands for heartache, loss, regret, and shame. It reminds us of failure and fault, hopelessness and despair, but if there is something that *convinces* us that we're more than the mistakes of yesterday – as Backman suggests – it is Christ.

The light of Christ reminds us that the darkness is *part* of us, but not *all* of us. It reminds us that the not-so-*best*-of-us, is also not the *rest* of us. The rest of us *is*, in fact, the light of Christ. The anticipation of something better awaiting as the result of our next choice and the hopes and dreams of all our tomorrows. Advent may begin in darkness, but it doesn't end there. It is very much a journey that reveals the truth of John 1:5 – that there is no darkness within us or around us that cannot be overcome by the light when it comes.

I closed the sermon I had planned to deliver this past Sunday with the following challenge, which I offer as a conclusion to these weekly words as well:

Between now and next Sunday, you are asked to write two prayers, as long or as short as you like. The first is a prayer for the "world" (the literal world or our country, state, or neighborhood, but the "world" beyond ourselves). What is something you want God to save us from (collectively)? Secondly, write a prayer for yourself. Take time to look within you. Where do you see darkness inside? What is it within you that you want God to save you from? You don't need to share these prayers with anyone but God. The second one especially is likely to be very personal, but as we take on this challenge together, let us also remember that even though this world is full of darkness, we believe that Christ is laboring, even now, to bring his light so that our journey will end in triumph. Thanks be to God.

STEWARDSHIP Ways of Giving - Did you Know? CORNER

Are you thinking of making a donation to Central from your IRA this year? Even though the required

minimum distribution has been waived for 2020, if you are age 72, or were 70 1/2 before January 1, 2020, you may do so without a withdrawal penalty. Are you aware you can avoid paying income tax on that withdrawal? It may sound too good to be true, but it's not.

Here's how - there is a provision within the Internal Revenue code known as the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). If age requirements are met, you can make a gift directly from your traditional IRA account to a qualifying charity. The gift can be up to \$100,000, but smaller amounts are also very meaningful. When you make such a gift from your IRA directly to a charity, you do not pay income tax on that withdrawal. However, if you choose to utilize itemized deductions, that QCD contribution cannot be included.

The Stewardship Team hopes you find this information helpful as you consider your giving strategy.


