Minister's Article

Ministry in a Phygital World

At the beginning of 2022, our Public Relations and Evangelism Committee read a book called The Phygital Church. Written by Angee Byrd - Associate Minister for Communications for the Christian Church in Illinois and Wisconsin - the purpose of the book is to help churches navigate a new world (exacerbated by Covid) in which people are participating in a congregation's ministries both physically (in person) and digitally (online). One of the takeaways for me involved a church's posts to social media (for us at Central, this consists primarily of Facebook). Byrd suggests that when making posts, graphics are more likely to be a viewed than plain text and video posts more likely to be viewed than mere graphics. Furthermore, "informational" videos are more valuable than "attractional" videos. Informational videos tell people about us, while attractional ones advertise things we are doing. It may seem counterintuitive - not to emphasize invitations to join us. But in a world where people are inundated with advertisements, people take an invitation for granted. What is more compelling – the theory goes – is to put more content "out there" about who we are and then allow people to accept the implied invitation if and when they feel ready.

Currently, both our contemporary and traditional services are posted each week. Additionally, I post a 5 minute bible study every Thursday morning on the sermon text for that coming week. Recently our PR/Evangelism committee decided to produce three (3) videos that being posted in October. They are attempts to offer more "informational" content. I'm including the text for the first two here and the dates when they will be posted. If you're on Facebook, feel free to share these to your personal page.

(What We Believe - Communion: posted October 6)

I wanted to share with you today what we believe about communion. In some places, this is known as the Eucharist or the Great Thanksgiving. We call it the "Lord's Supper" or "Communion." First, we believe that communion should be celebrated every week. We believe the bible shows us that every time the first Christians gathered for worship, they broke break together. We also believe that the bread and cup are not the literal body and blood of Christ. They are symbols of his body and blood. But the spirit of Christ is really and truly present in our gathering around the table and breaking bread together. Finally, and most importantly, we believe that everyone is welcome to receive the bread and cup of communion. We believe this is Christ's table and not ours. It is our job to invite you, and connect you, to Christ, and not judge you for a reason why you shouldn't be connected to him. So whether you're a member of our church or not, you will always be welcome at this table, here. The only thing anyone required at our church is that you have a desire in your heart to draw near to the love and forgiveness of Christ. So come, join us for worship. You'll always be welcome at this table.

(What We Believe – Baptism: to be posted October 13)

I'm Michael Karunas, pastor at Central Christian Church, and I wanted to share with you today what we believe about baptism. First, we believe that the bible shows us that immersion was the original way people were baptized. So that is what we practice today. Immersion means the whole body submerged under water, which takes place here – in a what we call the baptistery.

Second, we believe that baptism comes after a person confesses their faith in Christ. So we do not baptize infants; rather, we wait until a person is old enough to articulate faith for themselves. There's no "magic" age when this happens, but, generally, it's sometime in their youth or young adult years, but it can also happen at any age. We also believe that baptism is a sign of God's promise to save you because of your faith that can encourage you throughout your life. Now... if you come to our church, having been baptized as an infant, that's okay. We respect God's work in your life in the past and accept other forms of baptism. And you don't have to be baptized again, by immersion. But this is how we understand and practice baptism for those raised in our church.
