Just Flicks, Sunday, October 13th, 6:00 PM, First Pres. Church- "Departures"

Departures tells the story of an unemployed cellist who returns to his hometown and finds work as a traditional ritual mortician. This job exposes him to cultural taboos against people who work in the mortuary field.
