Minister's Article

"November 3"

In the Christian Church, ordination reflects the three-fold covenant we value as a denomination. In particular, the General church (think: international church) determines the requirements for ordination. The Regional church (our region is Illinois and Wisconsin) interprets and implements those criteria for individuals seeking ordination. The local church (e.g. Central Christian Church) sponsors candidates for ordination. Thus, a candidate requires a congregation which sponsors him/her and must meet the expectations of the region, which has already determined for itself how it is interpreting the over-arching expectations of the general church. As an example, the general church has decided that "An informed faith in Jesus Christ" is a requirement for ordination. It is up to individual regions to decide how they want to measure that, and it is up to a congregation, understanding the expectations of its particular region, to recognize this informed faith and call to ministry in individuals whom it sponsors for ordination. Ordination is an example of the way authority and responsibility are shared more laterally than hierarchically in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

In the Illinois and Wisconsin region, an individual seeking ordination comes "under care" of the ministry committee and meets with it regularly for a period of 2-3 years. There are papers to write, interviews to undertake, and educational requirements to meet. This reflects an understanding that pastoral authority comes from three locations – first from God (naturally), but also from the church body that provide credentials, as well as the congregation that recognizes an individual's gifts of ministry.

November 3 will mark the ordination of Tina Miller, our associate minister here at Central, and I wanted to take this opportunity to share with people what this ordination service will look like. It will take place in the afternoon, at 3:00 p.m. This is to allow guests we would like to invite (including other clergy who will be at their own houses of worship that morning) to attend. The service will be a blended one – as we seek to reflect our unity as a congregation, though we do not have a uniformity of worship styles. To that end, the service will be in the sanctuary. We will utilize both the contemporary praise band, as well as the chancel choir, organ, and traditional hymns. We will have bulletins which outline the service order, but we will also be installing a projection screen to display images and words relevant to the service.

The service will follow a customary worship order, and whether you prefer our contemporary or traditional service, you should be able to feel at home as the service unfolds. Tina has asked me to preach her ordination sermon, and I am honored to do so. Following the sermon — and truly the high point of the service — will commence the Rites of Ordination. Our regional minister will be present to ask Tina to make solemn vows to uphold the integrity of the ministerial office. She will likewise ask the congregation to make our own promises of support and commitment. Following this, there will be gifts given to Tina. There are four (4) specific gifts that are standard for any ordinand: 1) a robe; 2) a stole (to be worn over the robe); 3) a Bible (or other religious book or representation of the Word of God); and 4) a communion set. Following a service of communion by intinction (the style implemented at every contemporary service and at traditional Christmas eve service), the service will

conclude and we will transition to a reception in the Friendship Center.

A committee comprised of church members from each of our three services has been working on the arrangements and particulars of this service. This further represents our collective attempt (and desire) that this ordination service is an occasion to bring us together – three services and two worshiping styles, but one congregation, unified in a common love for Christ, Central Christian Church, and one another. I hope to see you there!
