Minister's Article

"Before or After?"

There once was a particular congregation that took up the collection of offerings before the sermon. The church was struggling financially, but the pastor believed the church members just weren't giving at the level they could. For its part, the membership loved their pastor but thought him to give excessively long-winded sermons. One morning, before the offerings were collected, the pastor stood up said, "Beloved congregation... I have three different sermons which I am prepared to deliver to you this morning. You will decide which of the three sermons I will give." At this point, the members perked up in their pews. Choice? In the preaching? They had never thought they would be granted so rare and important a task. Accordingly, and with eager interest, they listened with keener attentiveness. The pastor went on. "The first sermon is designed to last 2 minutes but is worth \$1,000. The second is a 30 minute sermon and is worth \$500. The last is a sermon that will easily take 2 hours to finish, but is worth only \$50. Let the deacons now collect the offerings... and we shall see how long I will preach this morning."



Okay, okay. So this is obviously a fictitious story, and I would never think of implementing such a fundraising strategy at Central, though we also collect our offerings *before* the sermon. (That is, at our traditional services. At the contemporary service, worshipers usually deposit their offerings in an offering box after they come forward for communion, which happens to be after the sermon. Moreover, with online giving through our website, some people would likely be fine if we didn't collect offerings at all during worship, as they offer theirs at times other than Sunday morning.) At our traditional services, it has been our custom to collect offerings *before* the sermon since long before many of us can probably remember.

This past Sunday, however, as we celebrated Consecration Sunday, we collected offerings after the sermon. We have done this before on Consecration Sundays and I, for one, enjoy this periodic change. I appreciate it for what it does for the theological flow of the overall service. After we gather with song, call to worship and invocation, asking God to bless us with divine presence – we then open ourselves to God as we are (as a congregation) in the pastoral prayer. Here we praise God for who God is; confess our unworthiness of God's grace and mercy; thank God for what God has done for us; and share with God our deepest fears, worries, and concerns. Having done this, we then gather around the Word of God – through an anthem that conveys the worship theme; the reading of scripture and the sermon (a reflection on that scripture). Then... our offerings, collected after the Word, represent our response to that Word. God feeds us with the Word and in return, we show our gratitude for having received that Word by our giving. Communion, which then follows the (continued on page 3...) offering, is our reminder that no matter how much we do – through our giving, faithful choices, and decisions – we are ultimately saved by the grace and mercy of our loving God, so vividly seen in the celebrating of communion.

I enjoy having the offering collected after the sermon on the day we share our Estimates of Giving for how we plan to support the church for the coming year (as we did this past Sunday). Since we spend the sermons during this time of year talking about the importance of giving, it seems only right that we collect them *after* we are done talking about them. In a sense, each sermon is an extended invitation to offering during the month of October. Our tradition of collecting offerings at Central in the sanctuary *before* the sermon is a fine one and it has served us well – practically and emotionally – over the decades, but I do appreciate the change-of-pace that collecting them after the sermon affords us to think about what we do, *theologically*, differently.
