Minister's Article

Advent Reflections

Advent is a time in the church year dedicated to waiting and patience, and while waiting and patience are probably not the eager domain of many (or any) of us, they are a crucial part of our spiritual development. For centuries, Christians have used the Advent season to ponder the deeper mysteries of faith, such as the importance of waiting and patience. Additionally, Advent is a time to consider a world without the Christ who is to come. Here are some cited thoughts about some of these spiritual themes. As you continue to move toward Christmas with your personal preparations, may words and thoughts such as these cause you to discover a new depth of your faith in, and commitment to, the Christ who comes.

Advent is often a time of opening our homes to neighbors, friends, and family. We welcome new visitors in our churches during this season of preparation. Hospitality is a central piece of our faith lives. And it is true that time and time again in our sacred scriptures, we are reminded not just to welcome those we know but the stranger as well. We need this reminder to welcome one another, not only in our physical lives, but in our prayer lives as well. During this season when we welcome people, well-known and new, let us take time in prayer to ask God whom we are overlooking, unintentionally or not, because when we extend welcome to others, we extend welcome to the Christ child in our midst.
