# **Advent Reflections**

Christmas is about the incarnation. It is about God becoming human and dwelling among us — so that we, who are human, might one day live eternally with God. One of the more poignant Advent poems (meant to be sung as a hymn) that I have come across is an English carol from the Middle Ages. It anticipates Christmas Eve, for which we are preparing next week, and it speaks to the essence of the incarnation which we celebrate at Christmas.


> > Now let good Christians all begin A holy life to live, And to rejoice and merry be, For this is Christmas Eve.

His silent movie repertoire includes several Charlie Chaplin comedies as well as the famous horror films The Phantom of the Opera and Nosferatu.


Randy is responsible for the

Elkins teaches music as a tool for good health - helping cope with arthritis and warding off dementia for the elderly - by exercising the brain and the fingers. He is also actively coaching and mentoring a coterie of young professional singers, actors, and church musicians in Atlanta.
