Minister's Article

You'll Learn What This is For Later

On my first official day as senior pastor of Central back in March 2012, then head custodian Dave Flanders pulled me aside and gave me my keys to the building. He placed in my hand a key-ring with 4 keys on it. "This," he said pointing to one, "is the main key for almost all of the doors you will ever use. This one," he said pointing to another, "is for the audio cabinet in the sanctuary." He started to walk away. I stopped him. "What about these other two?" "Those," he replied, "You'll figure out what they're for as you go along." I began to laugh, thinking he was kidding. Why would one possibly have keys but not know what doors they unlocked? How could one do their job adequately without having all the information that could be available to them? Alas, Dave wasn't kidding and over time I did figure out what purpose those two extra keys served. And Dave was right. They weren't nearly as important as the first two. Every so often, in the last seven years, Dave and I have laughed about this awkward first introduction between us. And I have thought often about how this is such a good illustration for life.

On the journey through life, there are moments of sadness, doubt and hardship. There are times of frustration and impatience. There are days on which we feel we are spinning our wheels at best, or aimlessly wandering at worst. We want to know where the road ahead is leading. We prefer to be able to prepare for the possible pitfalls that may await us. Yet sometimes we cannot. We simply don't have all of the information we'd like to have. But even though there is much we do *not* know on the journey of faith, there are always two things we *do*. God is with us – even in the driest desert. And God will provide for our future using the very things we have in our midst right now. These are like the two extra keys placed in my hand those years ago. We may not know exactly how God will use what is within us and around us to provide for our futures. But that doesn't mean that what we have right now will not one day be the very thing we need to continue moving toward God.

This month in worship our focus is on "seeking wisdom." The process of seeking, and ultimately attaining wisdom, fits into this paradigm as well. We don't gain wisdom all at once. It comes to us gradually. The reason we think of wise people as older than we are is for this reason. There is nothing magically connective about wisdom and age. After all, there are plenty of older folks who can act as foolishly as the most juvenile of pre-adolescents. But when wisdom comes, it is generally not as a bolt of lightning but rather as a slow and gradual process. It is something that is "figured out as we go" more than it is a treasure we discover at the end of a long hunt. To figure it out as we go takes great diligence on our part. It involves cultivating our relationship with God amid the demands of all of our human relationships.

In our scripture reading from this past Sunday, Luke 2:41-52, Jesus models for us how we can do that. First, by making time to be in the House of God. Second, by spending time in the Word of God. And finally, by listening to the Teachers of God. As we seek wisdom these are three keys Jesus places in our hands; tools we can use as we figure out how to make God's Word that which guides our actions as we move forward on our life journey. So it is that in our lives, when we make time to be in God's house; make time to read God's Word; and find those we trust with whom we can discuss that Word, we not only strengthen our relationship with God, we also gain a wisdom that gradually grows over time and helps ensure that the Word of God is guiding our earthly actions.
