# Minister's Article

# Future Staffing

Within the last calendar year, we have experienced three significant staff changes at Central. As we posted on Facebook last week, July 3 marked the one-year anniversary of Dr. Ben Hawkinson's tenure with us as choir director! Clearly, we are delighted by his presence with us and his manifold giftedness. Yet, Ben's arrival was due to the fact that Don Martin retired after 23 years of ministry at the end of June 2021, and at the end of June 2022, Tina Miller left to pursue other ministry ventures as well. These latter two changes have undoubtedly raised questions regarding "the plan" for staffing at Central in the future.

First, filling ministry positions in the church always takes time, but it is always worth it to be patient in such situations. And while I do realize there might be feelings of worry in the short run, I do believe in the long run we will be fine from a staffing perspective.

Secondly, I envision a multi-faceted scenario in which we: a) expand some current staff members' job descriptions; b) bring on part-time ministry staff members; c) seek a full-time, ordained minister to join us as an associate.

Thirdly, along the way, I envision our lay people (especially the elders) stepping up as well to take on a larger role in the area of visitation and pastoral calling. I believe doing so is not just "of help and assistance" to the church, it is also something that could bring out gifts for ministry in our members that could be transformational for them.

Fourthly, in the immediate meantime, we are planning the following:

- You will see Vicky Woolridge our ministry intern last fall helping out with worship leadership on Sundays and filling the pulpit when I am gone at the end of this month.
- Don Martin will be helping out with some special visitation as well. I have talked with Don about making some calls for me on Fridays for the foreseeable future. Both he and I want you to know that he is not "back" in the way that he was before he retired (after all, he is retired). But he is looking forward to being involved in a limited way and on this basis.
- I look forward to working with the elders on a program of visitation with our members in assisted living arrangements and long-term care facilities. This visitation would build on the communion calling elders are already doing and help us stay connected with one another.

One of the core principles guiding our ministry of the last 10 years has been "Connection." It is important to me – as senior minister – that everyone feels connected to the church; that they feel the church "sees" them and cares about them. The value of having more professional ministers on staff is that this is the way care and concern has traditionally been communicated. However, it is not the only way. I believe there are tremendous gifts for ministry already among us and that we are already - with our current staffing - capable of expressing care and concern for one another in ways that can make us feel every bit as connected. What will always change over time is how care, concern and connection are being expressed and experienced.

# **Bringing Back Liturgists!**

This month, we would like to bring back the role of Liturgist in our worship services. The Liturgist leads the congregation in the call to worship and offers the invocation at the beginning of worship. The Liturgist is a lay person (non-staff) and serves on a rotating basis. Prior to the Covid pandemic we utilized Liturgists like this on a weekly basis. When we moved to virtual-only worship in March of 2020, the Liturgist role was filled by a staff person and we've never stopped doing this. But now it is time to bring back the Liturgist! If you are interested in being on the Liturgist rotation, here is what you need to know:

- We have Liturgists for both traditional and contemporary worship. The traditional worship Liturgist serves at both the 8:00 and 10:30 services. The contemporary worship Liturgist serves at 9:15 only.
- Ministry staff will provide the Call to Worship. The Liturgist is asked to supply the prayer (Invocation).
- Everyone interested in serving as Liturgist is asked to attend an orientation meeting in early August (date TBD).
