# Minister's Article

# **Thought Seeds**

Midwesterners understand the Law of the Harvest. We live it! It appears around every corner; we see green corn and bean fields filled with a promised yield, and we observe how single seeds exponentially multiply into great harvests. In witnessing the Law of the Harvest, we might be reminded to remain true to our faith beliefs and practices that lead to peace. Let me explain by using the *Law of the Harvest Formula*.

Thoughts are carried out or realized through actions (one's interactions with God, self, others, and the environment). Repeated actions are habits. Habits form character. Character is an essential element in shaping a (our earthly and our eternal) destiny. ~ 1856, The Essex Standard

Consider a thought as a seed planted in your heart and mind. In following *The Law of the Harvest* formula, we see that a single thought properly nurtured holds tremendous power (exponential multiplication) to shape one's destiny toward or away from peace. Thoughts that support healthy faith beliefs and practices will produce a harvest of peace (the fruit of righteousness). Thoughts that contradict healthy faith beliefs and practices will produce a harvest of distress, agitation, and conflict.

Prophets of God have good understanding about the Law of the Harvest and how seeds of thought lead to or away from peace. The Old Testament is filled with examples of a prophet's Message.

Old Testament stories reveal that God's people were tempted to think like others who lived in the same territory. Thought leads to action and eventually God's people worshiped foreign Gods, participated in idolatry, and joined pagan ritual practices—all of which contradicted God's law.

God sent the prophets with a Message. Prophets reminded the people that they were set apart and chosen by God. God wanted the best for them. Thinking like others and getting caught up in faith practices and beliefs that pulled God's people away from God would lead to distress, agitation, and conflict. The prophets declared Warning and Restoration, Truth and Grace!

The prophets confronted bad thought seeds God's people had and challenged them to do better. Prophets exhorted the Israelites to keep the Word of God first place in their hearts and minds so thought seeds of peace would be planted and abundant peace would be harvested.

Prophecies of the Old Testament were fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Through Christ, we are all chosen by God. Today God offers relationship, His Word, and the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to help us with planting healthy thought seeds that yield a peace for ourselves and others.

Maybe the midwestern fields are your reminder to ask, "What seeds have I planted in my heart and mind today?"


