## Minister's Article

## **Justice and Mercy**

"We too often want mercy for ourselves but justice for others." I heard a preacher speak those words in a sermon years ago, and they've stayed with me ever since. I was moreover reminded of them two weeks ago as I was reading through Luke 15:1-10 (our sermon text from September 11). In those verses, Jesus was associating with tax collectors and sinners and eating with them. This was too much for the Pharisees and Scribes, who grumbled and felt Jesus should not be doing such a thing. Bear in mind that Jesus had just spent all of the preceding chapter (Luke 14) associating and dining with them! That was okay. But dining with sinners and tax collectors? Out of the question! That was too much to bear.

The Scribes and Pharisees wanted mercy for themselves and justice for others. They wanted others to be judged for what they didn't deserve and themselves to be graced for what (in their minds) they did. Yet the fact that Jesus would choose to eat with *anyone* — Pharisee, tax collector, or anyone in between — was a gift that no one "deserved." The great human tendency is to assume that what we have is something we have somehow earned, while what others have is due more to luck and good fortune than anything else. This fact is illustrated in a story that comes down from the Jewish tradition:

The Lord appeared to a hard-working farmer and granted him three wishes, but with the condition that whatever the Lord did for the farmer would be given double to his neighbor. The farmer, scarcely believing his good fortune, wished for a hundred cattle. Immediately he received a hundred cattle, and he was overjoyed... until he saw that his neighbor had two hundred. So he then wished for a hundred acres of land, and again he was filled with joy until... he saw that his neighbor had two hundred acres. Rather than celebrating God's goodness, the farmer could not escape feeling jealous and slighted because his neighbor received more than he. Finally, he stated his third wish: that the Lord take away half of what he had. And God wept.



I wonder if the key toward greater human connection doesn't have something to do with each of us understanding that whatever we have – in whatever quantity we have it – is a gift. And that how we interact with that gift has less to do with determining the reason for our having it and more with appreciating the fact *that* we have it.
