"Preparing for the Future"

Do you remember what you wanted to be "when you grew up?" What you first dreamed of being when you were a small child? It's a question we ask of children from time to time. It's something we probably thought about when we ourselves were young children, but only in the vaguest and most conceptual of terms. In my first year of ministry, I asked this question during the children's message. One girl, about 4-5 at the time, chimed up boisterously, "I want to be a doctor!," then there was a bit of pause before she continued, "or a checker at Walmart!" Today she is in her mid-20s and, to my knowledge, chose neither of those two career options. Me? I remember thinking of wanting to be an astronaut, a fireman, or a baseball player. Certainly they were more glamorous to imagine than a *biostatistician*, which both of my parents were.

It is not until much later that we begin to take our future career paths seriously. Often, there are fits and starts, as we pursue one option and venture down its path, only to veer off and be led in a new direction. For those who attend college, it is not uncommon to "switch majors" multiple times in a 4-5 year period. There may be historical reasons for this. Generationally, much has changed in the last half-century. There was a time when one might enter a trade or profession and remain in it their entire working career. Today, the average person is likely to change jobs and even vocational areas multiple times throughout their lifetime, and the Gig Economy practically ensures that there will be a diversity of options pursued as one finds their way as a working adult.

What hasn't changed, however, is the need to prepare oneself for their intended future. Regardless of the career path one chooses, in order to be a viable candidate in that field, preparation is required. This could be a combination of formal education, practical experience, and networking savvy.

In Luke 14:25-33, our scripture for last Sunday, Jesus speaks about undertaking building projects and kings and generals going off to war. He is not, however, referring to the professions (architecture and the military, for example). On the contrary, the focus is *preparation*. It is about not charging into the future without giving thought to what the future requires of you. Ultimately, the future to which we are all called – as his followers – is that of disciples. Jesus wants us to have a clear picture of the demanding life and lifestyle to which we are called. It is one of being willing to "take the lower place" (Luke 14:10) and "inviting to your table those who cannot repay you" (Luke 14:12-14). It is one of putting the eternal promises of Christ over the competition for earthly and temporary things (Luke 14:15-21), and it is one of choosing to value the relationship we have with Christ over the material possessions that can bring us so much comfort.

Regardless of our occupation in life, we are all called to the spiritual vocation of discipleship. On that path, Jesus desires that we have a clear picture of what that entails. For while the blessings it offers are abundant, so is the responsibility, and it is in the intersection of blessing and responsibility that we are changed and others are changed through our own transformation.
